

<u>**Trainings**</u> – includes trainings offered across the Network between July 2023 and March 2025, with most trainings tailored to food access.

Food Insecurity Screening-Food insecurity screening data was obtained from six FQHCs in VT from 2022 through March 2025. Screening rates have increased over time while the patients screening positive for food insecurity has remained fairly steady at an average of 5.55%. The Hunger Vital Signs is the primary tool used at FQHCs to determine food insecurity.

<u>Mini Grants</u>-The Network has awarded eight grants to support the implementation and expansion of programs that enhance food access and health care efforts across Vermont. Details about each funded program are available on our <u>website</u>. New funding opportunities are announced each winter, with awards granted in July, contingent on continued federal funding.
